Love is patient, love is kind and is not jealous; **love does not brag** and is not arrogant ...1 Corinthians 13:4-6 by JENNIFER PIERCE

We have been looking at these descriptions of perfect love over the past few months. This month is one that we don't think of very often, in my opinion. Love does not brag. What does it mean to brag? We know part of the meaning. The Greek word translated brag in this verse means to show off verbally using embellishments, praising oneself excessively. This definition makes me think of a sign I saw recently in Bass Pro Shop. There was a place on the wall for pictures that said "Braggers and Liars." I thought that was unfair to group those people together, but now I understand a little better. When we try so hard to make ourselves look good, we find it's a lot easier to do so when we embellish the story a bit.

The instances where people in Scripture bragged are related closely in that they include someone jumping to a quick decision that shows poor judgment. Proverbs 25:8 says, "Through insolence comes nothing but strife." In the book of Daniel, Nebuchadnezzar had a dream about a statue that told the future of his empire. His kingdom was represented by a head of gold. Soon after, he ordered that a gigantic golden statue be made for the whole kingdom to worship. Seems that his golden head status went to his head! Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego wouldn't worship it, so he had them thrown in the fiery furnace. Scripture tells us that because of his anger, he impulsively had the furnace heated up extra-hot, so that the men who threw Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were killed just from being close enough to throw them in. The pride that causes this kind of bragging destroys others. Not only does it destroy the target, but also those around us who are completely innocent bystanders.

Does this make you wonder how to cure bragging? We feel the need to brag when we feel the need to prove ourselves worthier than someone else. But nothing makes us more worthy than when we realize that God made each of us just the way He wanted us to be and that He loves us just the way we are. Yes, we should strive for holiness, but I don't have to strive to decorate like some of my friends or cook like other of my friends. I don't have to have as long a to-do list or as full a closet as they do. I am worthy, not because of my bank account size or what activities my kids are in. I am worthy because I was made and loved by God.
