



Kindness

Love is patient, love is kind. - 1 Corinthians 13:4

It's a busy month for all of us ladies, and I encourage you to love above all else. All the holiday preparations are great, but let's remember that they are pointless if we do not love the people around us. That's the Christmas version of 1 Corinthians 13:1-3! Last month, we discussed what it means for love to be patient. Let's talk about kindness for a moment.

Kindness involves generosity, forgiveness, and mercy. Proverbs 31:20 says, "She extends her hand to the poor, and she stretches out her hands to the needy." Nehemiah 9:17 says, "You are a forgiving God, gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love."

Kindness is expressed as an imitation of God's love for us. Luke 6:35-36 "But love your enemies, and do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return; and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High; for He Himself is kind to ungrateful and evil men. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful."

Kindness toward others is motivated by God's kindness to us. Ephesians 4:32 "Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you."

Kindness is to be shown and taught. Each of us has influence over many others, including and especially our children. It is our responsibility to teach kindness to them. Proverbs 31:26 includes this in the description of an ideal woman, "She opens her mouth in wisdom, and the teaching of kindness is on her tongue."
