Passing It On

We all influence someone. In the book of Genesis, it becomes clear that the patriarchs all passed traits (both good and bad) along to their children. Abraham's faithfulness to God was carried on through several generations. Isaac copied his father's tendency to lie to stay out of trouble (Genesis 12, 20, & 26). Brother and sister Laban and Rebekkah both concocted schemes to deceive others through disguise (Genesis 27 & 29) and then Jacob's own sons used disguise to trick Jacob into believing Joseph was dead (Genesis 37). We can learn many lessons from these heroes of the faith. This time, let's look at their stories as a reminder that our actions profoundly affect the next generation.

It gets easy to think that no one is really watching what we do, say, or feel, but that is not true. Having four young children has made this point especially clear in my life. But even if you aren't a parent, children everywhere are watching you. They are watching the way you drive your car, listening to the way you talk, watching what you wear, laughing at what you think is funny, and observing even the smallest details like body language, facial expressions, and jewelry. How does that make you feel? Scared? Intimidated? Complimented?

My point in mentioning this is to remind you how simple it can be to pass on the worthwhile traits of godliness, beauty, and love. Little girls can learn your knack for creating or assembling the beautiful things in life. They can learn from you what a difference a smile can make, or how recognition can make others feel special. They can learn the obvious things like how to cook or make things, but they can also learn that not every woman has to dress like the celebrities they see on magazine covers to be beautiful. They can learn how to treat the men in their lives, how to worship God, how to be a good listener, and many other things. What can you teach the next generation?
