On Sunday morning, a number of men in our church stood and made a commitment to be courageous. They signed a commitment that gave some specifics to the command in Joshua 1:7, which says, "Be strong and very courageous. Be careful to obey all the law my servant Moses gave you; do not turn from it to the right or to the left, that you may be successful wherever you go." The resolution the men repeated was a strong promise to love God, serve their families, provide for them, and see to it that their household would serve the Lord.
