January 31, 2016 SERMON NOTES God Never Tempts Us James 1:13-18

I. Three things James teaches us about God and temptations.

A. Temptation is not of God.
¹³ Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am being tempted by God"; for God cannot be tempted by evil, and He Himself does not tempt anyone.
1(v. 2) are aimed at a given end: to make us stronger in our faith.
2. A is the solicitation to sin, the inner desire to do that which is contrary to the Law of God.
3. God tempts anyone to sin.
B. Temptation is of man, of his own lust and desires.
¹⁴ But each one is tempted when he is carried away and enticed by his own lust. ¹⁵ Then when lust has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and when sin is accomplished, it brings forth death.
1. Temptations appear to something
2. Temptations if left to grow results
C. Temptation is not of the nature of God.
¹⁶ Do not be deceived, my beloved brethren. ¹⁷ Every good thing given and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shifting shadow. ¹⁸ In the exercise of His will He brought us forth by the word of truth, so that we would be a kind of first fruits among His creatures.
1. God is the giver of all things
2. God's will for us is to know
